

Portuguese major requirements: 30 credit hours of Portuguese courses numbered 276 or above, plus, demonstrated skill (at the 202/212/276 level) in a third language - see note 3 below.

3 required courses (12 credit hours): either PORT 276 or 277 (6 credit hours each); and 2 of these options, PORT 301 and/or 311 and/or 312 (3 credit hours each).

6 elective PORT courses (18 credit hours) at the 300 and 400 level.

Important Notes (as referenced on page 1)

1. Intensive Language courses: 275 = 101 and 102 in one course (6 cr.hrs.); 276 = 201 and 202 in one course (6 cr. hrs)

Credit is only awarded for 101 and 102 - **OR** - 275, not all 3 courses - also - credit is only awarded for 201 and 202 - **OR** - 276

2. At least 2 of these 3 courses are required for Portuguese majors. All 3 may be taken and applied toward Port. Major.

3. Third Language credit hours may be applied to minor or second major requirements. The major requires "demonstrated" 202 skill level which may be established by either a Foreign Language Proficiency test administered by a faculty member, or by taking the necessary language courses. Due to the similarities between the two languages, Spanish is a recommended third language. Knowing both Spanish and Portuguese increases available job opportunities.

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Important Notes referenced on page 1

1. Intensive Language courses: 275 = 101 and 102 in one course (6 cr.hrs.); 276 = 201 and 202 in one course (6 cr. hrs)
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2. PORT 102 is a one semester introduction to Portuguese for Spanish Speakers, as well as, the 2nd semester sequence for non-Spanish speaking students.
3. Portuguese 277 (6 cr. hrs.) is an **accelerated course for Spanish speakers with strong language skills**. It is the equivalent of covering PORT 101, 102 & 276 in one semester.
4. At least 2 of these 3 courses are required for Portuguese majors. All 3 may be taken and applied toward Port. Major.
5. Third Language credit hours may be applied to minor or second major requirements. The major requires "demonstrated" 202 skill level which may be established by either a Foreign Language Proficiency test administered by a faculty member, or by taking the necessary language courses. Due to the similarities between the two languages, Spanish is a recommended third language. Knowing both Spanish and Portuguese increases available job opportunities.
