SUBJECT: Nomination of Candidates for Appointment as Regents' Lecturer

The College of Arts and Sciences invites nominations of candidates for the designation **Regents' Lecturer**. Regents' Lecturer is a special title bestowed on selected tenured junior faculty members (associate professors) who, in the judgment of the Dean on the advice of a faculty selection committee, merit recognition of their accomplishments in the areas of teaching, research, scholarship and leadership in both university affairs and national/international professional communities. Up to four of these appointments will be made for the period 2016-2019.

In addition to the title Regents' Lecturer, the appointment carries a stipend of \$2,900 that can be distributed, at the appointee's discretion, between extra compensation and professional development expenses (e.g., books, supplies, travel or equipment), with the provision that durable equipment purchased through this program remains the property of the University. The appointee's proposed distribution of the total stipend must include an 18% fringe benefit item, computed on the compensation amount selected, to cover the University's contributions for FICA, retirement, etc.

A complete nomination consists of the candidate's curriculum vitae, a statement describing their research and scholarship, a teaching portfolio, and a letter of nomination from the candidate's home department chair. The Chair's letter should outline the candidate's qualifications in all areas (teaching, research/scholarship and leadership) and the extent of faculty support within the department.

Completed nominations must be received in the College of Arts and Sciences no later than **Monday, May 13**. An advisory committee on selection will be formed and will review applications received in order to recommend appointees to the Dean.
