

Academic Advisor Expectations

As your Advisor you can expect me to:

- Understand and effectively communicate the curriculum, graduation requirements, and university and college policies and procedures
- Encourage and support students as they gain the skills to define and develop clear and attainable educational plans and goals
- Provide students with information about and strategies for utilizing the available resources and services on campus

Student Expectations

As an advisee, you have responsibilities in the advising partnership that can assist you in your development and movement with the college.

- Come prepared to each appointment with questions and/or material for discussion
- Be an active learner by participating fully in the advising experience
- Ask questions if you do not understand an issue or have a specific concern
- Be open to recommendations from your advisor
- Gather all relevant decision-making information

- Clarify personal values and goals and provide advisor with accurate information regarding your interests and abilities
- Become knowledgeable about college programs, policies, and procedures
- Accept responsibility for decisions
- Maintain confidentiality (will not discuss issues with parents or others without your written permission); we can only answer academic questions only via **unm.edu e-mail accounts with student ID**#.

Advisement Description

- As you continue your educational career at UNM, it is essential to stay familiar with the academic advisement process. All students are expected to become **partners** with their advisors as they map out the path they will follow to successfully graduate with a Bachelor's degree.
- All Arts and Sciences students are **encouraged** to meet with their Academic Advisor **at least once a semester**.
- Assist students in understanding the purpose and goals of higher education and its effects on their personal lives and future
- Be accessible during office hours for communication with students by appointment, walk-in advising, telephone, email, or web access.
- Maintain confidentiality

Mandatory Advisement

The College of Arts and Sciences requires visits at critical transition points in a student's academic career. Each visit is intended to ensure the students are equipped with specific information to be able to move forward while getting the most out of their college experience. While the following are mandatory, it is always **encouraged** to meet with your advisor more.



NSO – New Student Orientation

Objectives: Introduce students to UNM academic expectations, policies, and procedures. Teach students how to utilize UNM technology for registration and communication purposes.

New Student Learning Workshop

Objectives: Assist student in identifying academic resources, recognizing and scheduling department admission requirements for the next year and utilizing the degree audit.

Department Orientation

Objectives: Integrate students into the Department. Explain nuances of degree completion. Offer opportunities to enhance the student experience including but not limited to research, internships, and scholarships.

Graduation Planning Workshop

Objectives: Teach students to analyze outstanding degree requirements via degree audit; to plan coursework to meet both specific and general requirements; to project intended graduation date
