University Residence Requirements

- Minimum hours = 30
- Senior standing = 15 past 92
- At least 50% of Major
- At least 25% of Minor

Minimum graduation GPA = 2.00

Keep in mind that minimum grades on road map are for individual coursework only. Students must maintain a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average for admission to and graduation from the College of Arts and Sciences. Minimums listed for the individual courses do NOT meet the cumulative minimum. Scholarships will have different requirements. Please see your advisor for questions.

Important Notes

While a C is all that is necessary to complete a degree at UNM, to be competitive for Graduate Programs, all SHS courses must have a grade of A- or better.

Students must obtain a Master's Degree in Speech-Language Pathology in order to be an SLP.

The SHS courses are lock-step. This means they need to be taken in the order written.

Students need to study for and take the GRE the summer before their final fall semester.

If students plan to study abroad, they should go their 3rd semester.
